Managers, owners and supervisors/team leaders within the tourism, leisure and hospitality sector, and which are located in the Berkshire, South Oxfordshire and South Buckinghamshire area.

You will gain essential knowledge of how to prepare and provide facilities to meet the needs of the whole community ready for the 2012 Olympics and Paralympic Games. Learn which requirements your organisation needs to conform with.

- Assess your accessibility through a self-survey or access audit

- Provide services that meet the needs and expectations of disabled customers and others with specific needs
- Write an access statement
- Monitor and review your accessibility
- Develop an action plan to improve the accessibility of your organisation
